

SAFETY SATURDAY/SUNDAY GUIDELINES

1. THESE ARE RIDER EDUCATION ACTIVITIES! ALL TOPICS SHOULD BE SAFETY OR RIDING RELATED.
2. Each section Assistant District Director will be responsible for developing a method of selecting a host.
3. A typical event is four hours long usually Noon to Four pm and takes place during the off riding season in February and March. They should not be after Rider Courses begin in April!
4. Care should be taken when scheduling to avoid conflict with other sectional events. Ex; First Aid/CPR classes, area chapter fundraisers, gatherings, etc.
5. The host is responsible for securing a comfortable location and providing any audiovisual equipment needed.
6. The host is responsible for providing a sign-in sheet that includes Name, (Printed Please), GWRRA Number, and Chapter. This sheet must be forwarded to the District Educator.
7. The host, with help and suggestions from the section, will develop an agenda and arrange for presenters.
8. Certified Rider Education Presenters must be used for GWRRA based seminar material.
9. Seminars and presentations must be accurate in content and should not exceed 45 to 50 minutes in length.
10. No admission will be charged however a donation jar can be passed and food may be sold to help offset expenses.
12. The passport program is in effect for these events.
13. All agendas must be submitted in advance to the Assistant District Director and the District Educator for approval.
